### Pupil premium Review 2023.2024

#### Part B: Review of outcomes in the previous academic year

##### Pupil premium strategy outcomes

This details the impact that our pupil premium activity had on pupils in the 2022/23 academic year.

##### Overall Impact update:

- **Monster phonics was used effectively to improve phonics success for PP children, enabling all children to pass the phonics screener**
- **A phonics audit was undertaken providing additional funding to purchase phonics scheme reading books ensuring that children phonics was taught with fidelity**
- **Maths lead is continuing to attend the KS1 Mastery Number programme and is also undertaking an NPQ in Leading Teaching. A maths parents workshops was offered to parents to support them in understanding the support they can provide for children alongside information as to how children were taught in school. Staff are confident in delivering mastery learning activities in school.**
- **Vocabulary activities were used across the school and were effective in supporting the development of vocabulary with 83% of PP children achieving a vocabulary age at or above their chronological age**
- **Targeted interventions across KS1 and KS2 provided effective support with improving outcomes. Same day intervention enables staff to provide target support for children who have been unable to access objectives taught during the day.**
- **YARC reading assessment identified improved reading outcomes for PP and SEND children**
- **Specialist ELSA support was effective in supporting PP children and their families with bereavement, behaviour, social and emotional issues**
- **MHST parents workshops were attended providing parents with opportunities to discuss and learn about strategies that support children's mental health and well-being.**
- **Water Park trip was successful in boosting the confidence and resilience of the children. They built on friendships and forged new relationships with other peers.**
- **A number of our children enjoyed participating in a "Mini Police" project delivered by the local police force. This raised confidence and self-esteem promoting the children's profiles in school. They particularly enjoyed their graduation at the end of the term.**
- **Well-being clubs were well attended during play/lunchtimes**
- **Well-being warriors improved children's ability to recognise, understand and develop strategies for dealing with their emotions**
- **Supervision is in place to support staff and all staff access this.**
- **Children enjoyed accessing the additional clubs provided including a number of after school sporting events during the summer term**
- **PP children attended sporting events organised by Blackburn Rovers Community Trust**
- **Breakfast club was well attended by PP children**
- **Support was provided via CADs, CAF, Youth Support programmes and MHST**
