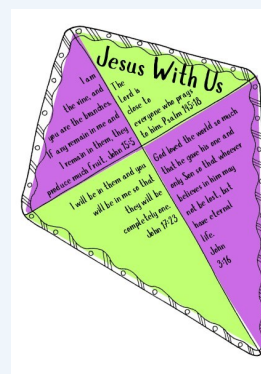
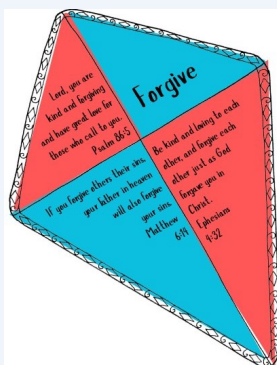
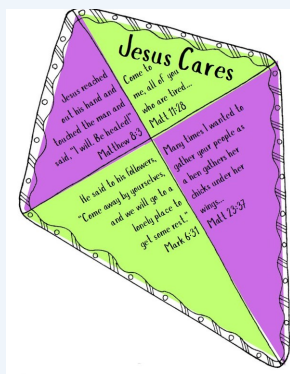

God loved the world so much that he gave His one and only Son, so that whoever believes in Him may not be lost, but have eternal life.

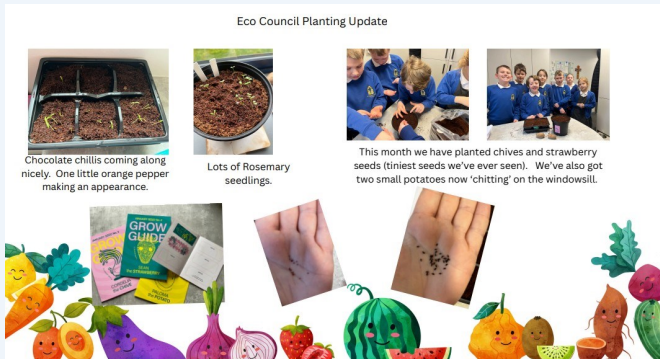

School Uniform

A few of the children are still attempting to 'Break the Rules' though! Please can we remind you that the children should be wearing grey/black /white socks or grey/white tights and that footwear for both school and PE should be black only shoes or trainers. (All black leather trainers ONLY are permitted as part of the uniform– these must not have additional colours in them). Children should also have removed nail varnish after the half term holidays and returned to plain gold or silver stud earrings.

Drinks (WATER) Bottles

All children should bring a drinks bottle to school each day which should only be filled with water—NO Juice! We are unable to provide cups for the children but if they bring a bottle filled with water this then stays in the classroom with them and is accessible when needed. Please ensure your child's bottle has their name on it and is clearly identifiable to them as we do have several identical looking bottles in school. Children are able to fill up bottles from our water dispenser at set times during the day if needed.

World Book Day

World Book Day will take place on the 4th March (a day early at Tockholes due to PE on Thursday 5th March). We are inviting children to come to school dressed as a character from their favourite book or film. Costumes can be as simple or as creative as you like—there is absolutely no expectation to buy anything new. We encourage families to use items they already have at home, borrow from friends, or put together homemade outfits to help keep costs to a minimum. To help with this we've attached a list of ideas to help including characters that wear their own clothes, pyjamas or certain colours.

We have a variety of author events happening, starting this Friday.

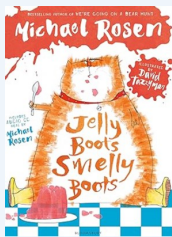
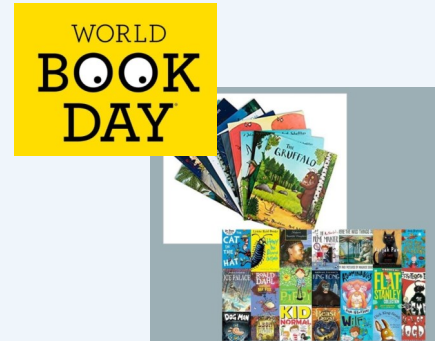

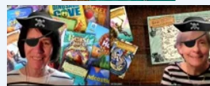

Easter Service

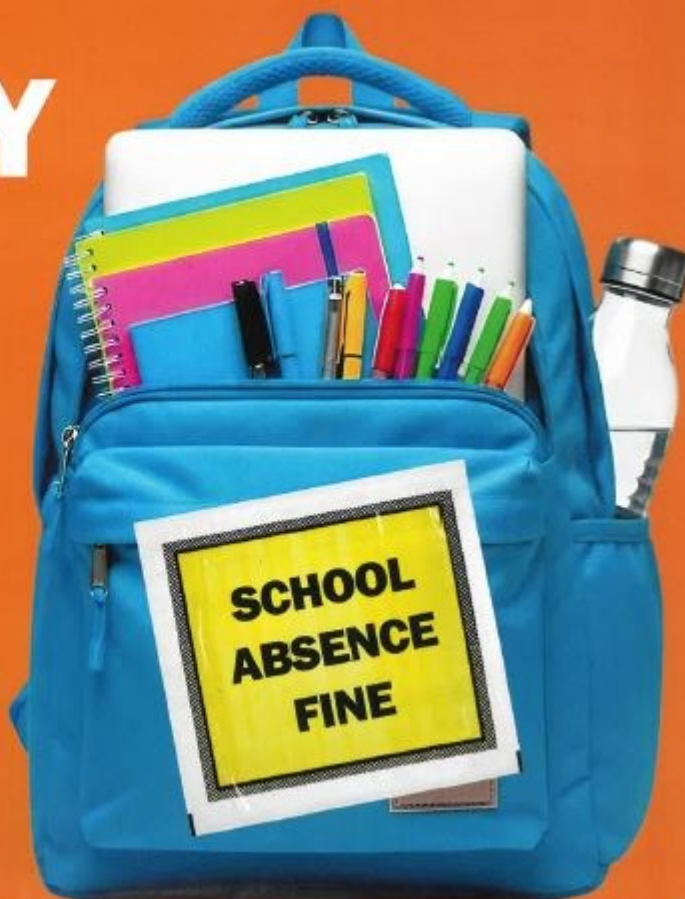

PENALTY NOTICE FINES

If your child misses school
without authorisation you
may be issued a fine



FIRST OFFENCE

If a parent receives a penalty notice for a child, they will need to pay **£160 (within 28 days)**. However, the fee is reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days of the notice.

SECOND OFFENCE

If a parent receives a second penalty notice for the same child within three years, it will cost a flat fee of **£160 if paid within 28 days**. There's no option to pay a lower amount.

THIRD/ FURTHER OFFENCES

A parent cannot get a third penalty notice for the same child within three years of the first one. If the parent reaches the limit again within those three years, other actions will be taken instead, like **legal steps or other attendance interventions**.
